



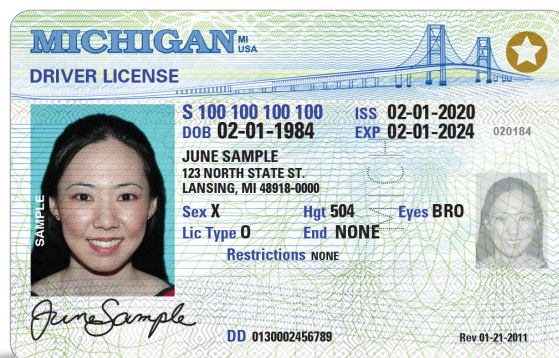
A guide to Voter ID at the polls

You will be asked to show ID when you check in to vote.

ID types you can use to check in are:

- Michigan driver's license or state ID
- Driver's license or personal identification card issued by another state
- Federal, state, county or local government-issued photo identification
- U.S. passport
- Military ID with photo
- Student identification with photo from a high school or accredited institution of higher learning
- Tribal identification card with photo

Your photo ID does not need to have your address on it. In addition, the name on your identification card may be a shorter form of your name. For example, "Bill" for "William" and "Kathy" for "Katherine" are acceptable.



If you don't have ID, you can still vote.

If you arrive at your polling place without ID, Michigan law still allows you to vote. A poll worker will ask you to sign an affidavit before voting that states you didn't have an ID. Your ballot will be included with all others and counted.
